Problem 1. Find the values of the following definite integrals, if they exist:

a)

$$\int_{1}^{\infty} \ln x \, dx$$
b)

$$\int_{0}^{1} \frac{x}{1-x^{2}} \, dx$$
c)

$$\int_{0}^{\infty} \frac{1}{e^{x}+e^{-x}} \, dx$$
d)

$$\int_{0}^{\pi/3} \frac{\sec^{2} x}{1-\tan x} \, dx$$
e)

$$\int_{0}^{2} \frac{x^{2}+2}{x^{3}-1} \, dx$$

Problem 2. Suppose that the region

$$R = \left\{ (x, y) : x \ge 0, \ 0 \le y \le e^{-x} \right\}$$

is rotated around the x-axis. Let S be the resulting solid.

a) Find the volume of S.

b) Find the surface area of S.

Problem 3. Solve the following initial value problem:

 $y' = e^{y-x} \sec y \ (1+x^2), \ y(0) = -1.$

Problem 4. Let a > 0 be a real number. Consider an initial value problem

(1)
$$y' + \frac{y}{x} - \ln x^a = 0, \quad y(1) = 1,$$

where x > 0. Solve (1).

Problem 5. Use the arc-length formula to find the circumference of a unit circle.
